The ideal district population, **38,939**, is based on the latest population estimate. **HD 4** has **38,971** people, which is **0.08%** from the ideal. **5%** of the people in the district are new constituents.

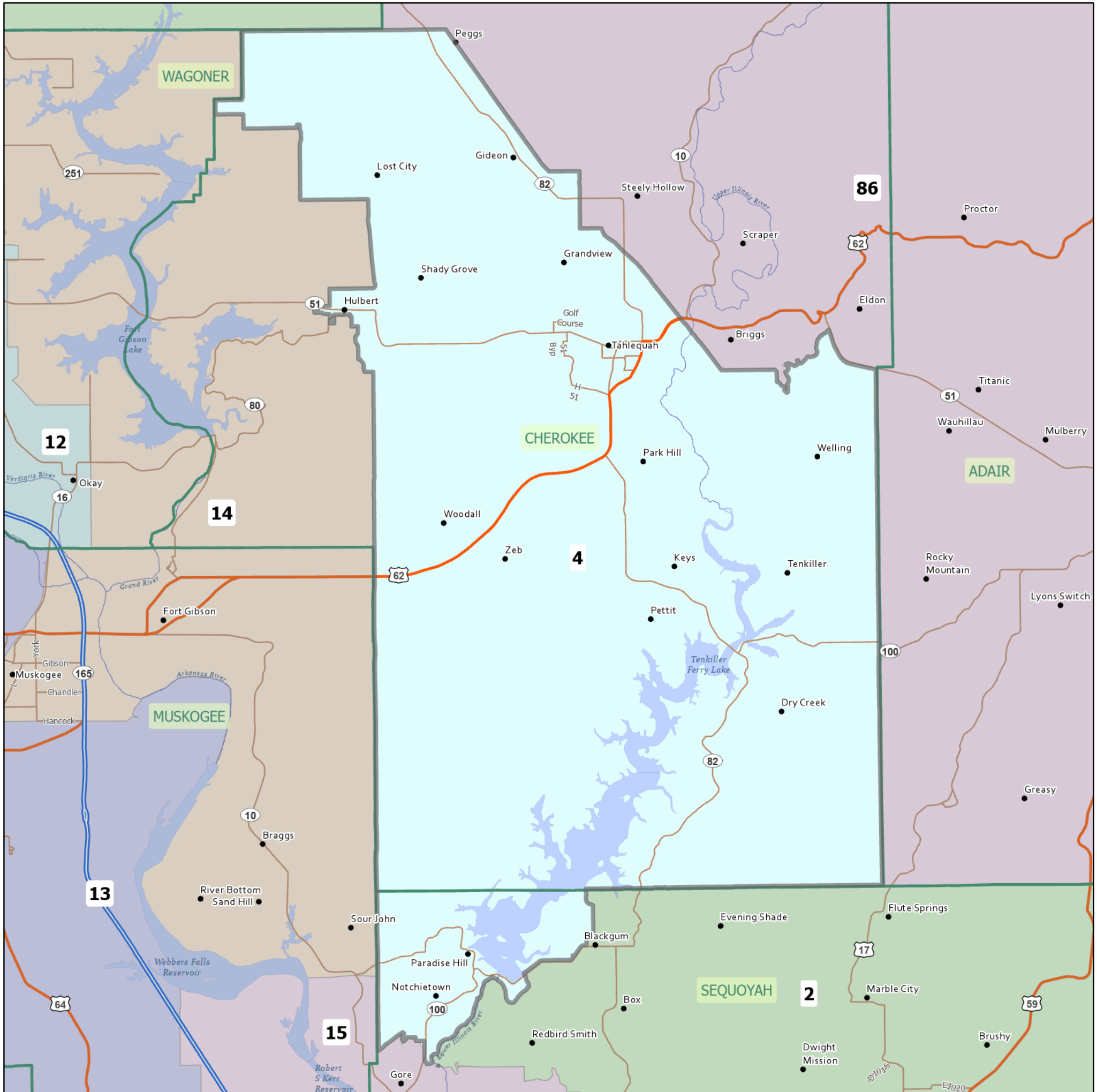
- 42.71% of the district is American Indian and Alaskan Native, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 1.53% of the district is Asian, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 2.79% of the district is Black or African American, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 0.42% of the district is Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 47.49% of the district is non-Hispanic white.
- 2.54% of the district is some other race or ethnicity.
- 7.64% of the district is of Hispanic or Latino origin.

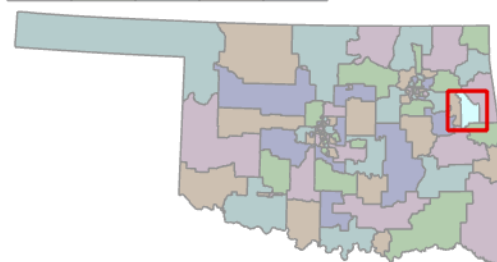
